General Information:

This course is an introduction to web site construction and maintenance. It is also a very limited introduction to computer programming.

If you want a course in how to use a computer (particularly in a business setting) take CIS 110 instead. CIS 110 is an introduction to using the most common types of computer programs.

If you want a course in computer programming, you should probably be taking CS120. There is no experience required for CS120, it is all programming, and is the standard first course in the computer science major.

Grading will be done about half on tests (of which there will be three or four) and half on laboratory assignments. Class members are encouraged to communicate with each other when preparing laboratory assignments. Each student's assignments must be unique, however.
