Grading: There are seven one-hour exams during the semester. Therefore, going into the final exam each student will have seven scores in the grade book. The score on the final exam will be entered four times, resulting in a total of eleven grades. The lowest two of these eleven grades will be dropped, resulting in nine scores. The average of these nine scores will be the numerical course grade. To determine a course letter grade, the following scale will be used: 93-100 is an A; 90-92 an A-; 87-89 a B+; 83-87 a B; 80-82 a B-; 77-79 a C+; 73-76 a C; 70-72 a C-; 64-69 a D+; 56-63 a D; 50-55 a D-; 0-49 an F. These are minimums. A curve might be applied at the end of the course.
